#### Financial achievements 2010 - 2017.

The KEMH Alumni was formed at

an initial meeting on 22 November 2010 when 10 members present paid their subscriptions. From humble beginning the Alumni has gone on to finance and publish the history of the hospital. In the period July 2013 to December 2016. \$188.000 was paid to historians Jenny and Bevan Carter for "King Eddies: a history of Western Australia's premier women's hospital 1916-2016". This was financed by arants and donations from the Hospital Special Purpose Account, RANZCOG, the College of Midwiferv. Mr and Mrs Rear. Millenium Minerals. Hevtesbury and others as well as funds raised through sales and functions. A short term loan through WIRF enabled the Committee to meet final payment deadlines. It was a tremendous effort from what was essentially a small group that produced a memorable product.

Over the time our Alumni has had a financial turnover of over \$240,000 and after paying all the costs of the publication of the book and other costs, is still in the black. We are debt free and ready for new inititatives which meet the objectives of the Alumni.
