Celebrations were held across NMHS for International Nurses Day, which recognises the vital role nurses play in the community. We thank our nurses for the high-quality care they provide to our patients each and every day. They shape the patient experience with their care, compassion and respect. Our nurses are kind, professional and dedicated leaders whose commitment is truly outstanding.



In June the NMHS launched a statewide Perinatal and Infant Mental Health Promotion and Prevention Plan for Infant Mental Health Awareness Week.

The Plan, which was launched by Hon. Ayor Makur Chuot MLC, Member for North Metropolitan Region, aims to support services and organisations to implement practical strategies to promote mental wellbeing and prevent mental health conditions during the perinatal and infancy period.

Research shows that the experiences and relationships we have in the earliest years of our lives, including before birth, impact on the development of our brains.

The plan was developed through consultation and collaboration with those working across infant and perinatal mental health care in Western Australia, including research, clinical practice and community settings.
